#### NC Dept of Transportation Joins Sidewalk Effort

In an important statement of support, Jeff Moore, DOT District Engineer has outlined how his department intends to assist in improving pedestrian safety on the Tunnel Road corridor. Mr. Moore reports DOT will later this year build a sidewalk on Tunnel Road from Crockett Rd at the entrance to Redwood Forest subdivision, westward to the entrance to the Asheville Mall. Also at the Crockett intersection, DOT will install a pedestrian crossing to the Haw Creek side of the Hwy 70.

Once complete, DOT will also build sidewalks on the steep section of Tunnel Rd fronting on the Bell School property opposite the Sonic Drive-in. Also included in improvements will be a pedestrian crossing at Maple Springs and Tunnel Rd. Completion of both DOT projects is expected by the end of 2011.


While the DOT is making these improvements, the City of Asheville has committed to building sidewalk on the dangerous and challenging curved section of Tunnel Rd between Groce Church east to Maple Springs Rd.

Taken together, these actions by the City of Asheville and NC Dept of Transportation, mean vital improvements in pedestrian safety on Tunnel Road, East Ashevilless main thoroughfare.

Evergreen Students Test Haw Creek Water Quality

The community of Haw Creek is tied together by many threads but one of the most vital is our watershed. Everyone living in Haw Creek is a part of the watershed. Anything poured on the ground eventually ends up in Haw Creek. The water quality of Haw Creek indicates the health of the entire valley ecosystem. Low water quality means that the water which feeds our plants and fills our streams could damage the ecosystem and our children too. In January and February, the 7th & 8th grade students from Evergreen Charter School tested water quality at several locations in the Haw Creek watershed. The Good news is that the water quality of our watershed looks great! Thank you to Mr. Miles and to all your students!

# Haw Creek Native

Interview with: Elizabeth Trantham

Due to turn 94 years old in May, Elizabeth "Lib" Trantham, has led a life of service to others. Even now, most every day she can be found volunteering at the Swannanoa nursing home where her younger sister, Louise, is a resident. She said, "I believe service to others is what keeps me going, I like helping people". She said this with a warm smile.

Shortly after graduating Haw Creek high School in 1934, Lib's first job was a sales girl in the Kress Department store earning \$1 a day. When she left the job in 1939, she we earning \$13 a week. About that time a friend introduced her to a handsome man in a military uniform. Later this man, Victor Trantham, visited her at the Kress store in civilian clothes. She asked him, "where's you uniform"? She recalled his words as if they were yesterday, "I got rid of it because I am going to marry you" Victor replied. Their marriage produced 2 children and lasted 61 yrs.

Part of a family with deep roots in the Haw Creek community Lib recalls the time with her brother Hugh, while serving stateside in the Air Force in WW II, called one Sunday morning to say he'd be doing a Haw Creek flyover later that day. Sure enough that afternoon, with his head out of the cockpit window, Hugh waved down as his plane buzzed up valley floor. Days later Ed Harper, the Millers Store butcher, told of a customer complaining that someone was stealing corn from his field. Asked how he knew of the theft, the customer reported finding a pair of glasses hanging from the top of a cornstalk.: the same glasses blown off brother Hugh's head during his famous flyover. Still in Lib' possession to this day, the glasses are a polgnant reminder of the fun-loving brother who did not make it out of WWII alive.

Lib is still living in the Trinity Chapel area in the home that she and her husband built in 1944.

She reflects on all the changes the she has seen. "Haw Creek used to be a farming community and most everyone kept chickens, pigs and cows. Much of that has changed but not all change is bad. I love my new sidewalks and enjoy watching people using them", as she said with a smile.
